## **Results and Admissions**

#### Results

In 2024, 74% of pupils achieved 5 or more GCSEs at grades C or higher and 56% of pupils achieved 5 or more GCSEs at grade C or above, including Mathematics and English. 45% of our students impressively achieved 7 or more GCSEs at grades C or above. These results are consistent with those of 2019 which indicates that we have maintained high standards following the impact of COVID-19 years. As we move into this new academic year, we work toward improving on these successes for the exam groups of 2025.

#### Mixed Ability Teaching in Year 8 at Laurelhill Community College

In Laurelhill Community College Year 8 pupils are organised into mixed ability teaching groups. This removes the need to test pupils in June and allows the focal point of Year 8 to be on building relationships and settling into life in a post primary setting.

The mixed-ability classroom creates equal expectations for all pupils and provides them with access to the same resources and opportunities as their peers. All students are held to high standards and are supported in their learning through differentiated teaching.

Upon entry into Year 9, pupils are streamed into groupings which best match their individual needs and learning styles. Factors which determine the class groupings from Year 9 onward include pastoral needs, data from assessments taken in school and class sizes.
